

DELANEY PLANS ALTERATIONS IN PROPOSED QUEENS LINES TO AID MOST RESIDENTS

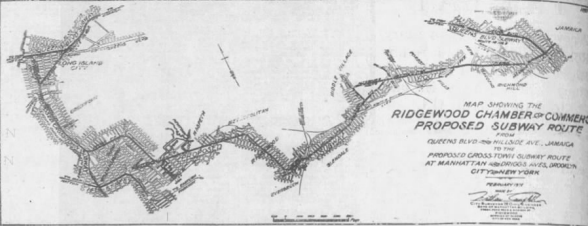
Necessary Changes Will Be Made on Existing Routes, But No New Subways Will Be Projected Until Present 6-Year Plan Is Completed.
